Meeting started at 7:32 pm

- 1. Welcome guests: Hi Edith!
 - A. Mike and Dawn excused
- 2. Set up for Kennewick Knights tournament
 - A. call to Diana Lam
 - 1. left voicemail to ask her to call back
 - 2. she called back 5 minutes later
 - B. Cathy K. spoke with Key Club to help set up
 - 1. set up tables, chairs, boards and tents
 - a. tents printed out already
 - b. not yet folded
 - c. cut and in order
 - d. has plenty of good staplers
 - 2. Dave M. has all the equipment, should arrive early
 - a. though it will be busy, no back door entry
 - b. they come out from all doors
 - c. will arrive by 3:30 pm
 - C. Gregg will handle pairings
 - D. Dave M. will plan on being TD
 - 1. if Stan can make it, he will judge
 - E. everyone in gym
 - F. quite a waitlist out there
 - 1. "it's a looooong wait list" –Edith
 - G. 39 6' tables, 78 boards, 156 players
 - 1. has 11 extra tables for scorers, registration, other
 - H. how big is the gym?
 - 1. does not have actual dimensions
 - 2. is there a way to use the library or something?
 - a. no, would have to open the whole school and monitor
 - I. any drops?
 - 1. only the 5 Edith gave
 - 2. filled in player list accordingly
 - J. Edith has one judge from high school
 - 1. Dave M., Dave C., Mike, Doug and possibly Stan should be enough judges
 - K. what are the sections?
 - 1. K-2, 3-4, 5-6, 7-8
 - 2. no overs or unders
 - 3. how many in each section?
 - a. 33, 40, 34, 48, respectively
 - 1. evenly split
 - 2. all greater than 32, less than 50

- b. 3 score keepers would be good
- 4. do you want to start any sections with clocks?
 - a. we want to utilize recently purchased clocks
 - b. definitely start with clocks in 7-8 section
 - 1. to prepare them for State
- L. post preliminary pairing to get the kids seated at 8:45am
 - 1. this allows for instruction in a quieter setting while Gregg makes any necessary adjustments
 - a. last minute drops and adds
 - b. people on waitlist on standby at tournament?
 - 1. no, just say no, without having them wait
 - 2. try to get drops early to allow for waitlist players
- M. Edith has to juggle tournament concerns and district training
 - 1. she says it should be entertaining
 - 2. Abel Lopez, the intermediate coach at Curie, will be there in her stead
- N. hoping to have the t-shirts for volunteers by Saturday
 - 1. wants to distribute these at the tournament, to those who signed up early enough to provide a shirt size
- O. do you have a microphone? Yes
 - 1. AA batteries?
 - a. had to replace the batteries in the microphone at the last one
- 3. Review minutes
 - A. minor change to U800 sections for Bishop Battle Star
 - B. Dave M. moved to approve minutes as modified, Stan seconded, all said "Aye"
- 4. Report on assignments
 - A. Dave M. spoke with t-shirt vendor
 - 1. he cleaned up logo
 - 2. should have first 30 shirts this Friday
 - a. can start handing these out at tournament Saturday
 - B. spoke with Shelby about artwork on boards
 - 1. as long as we send check tonight, they should arrive April 2nd
 - C. we need to buy totes and baggies for new sets
 - 1. zipper bags for chess pieces
 - a. will arrive in cardboard boxes, 40 sets a box
 - 1. 12 boxes in total
 - 2. clear totes so we can see what's in them
 - a. they also fit nicely on Costco rack, three to a shelf
 - b. 12 gallon size
 - 3. do we want to put new sets in baggies/totes prior to tournament?
 - a. that way we know how everything fits and don't have to deal with all that cardboard at tournament
 - 4. still borrowing storage space, near Fred Meyer
 - a. 2 empty Costco racks at storage
 - b. 15 totes fit each rack
 - 5. will need to purchase these before sets arrive
 - a. have a box opening party

- 6. Dave C. suggested a sturdier tote, available at Costco
 - a. may be too big to fit Costco racks as nicely as clear ones
 - b. can maybe fit two of these on a shelf, lengthwise
 - c. 10 totes on a rack, 2 racks
 - d. will need 17 totes for new sets, so it might work all right
- 7. 30 sets fit in tote currently used
- 8. what about boards?
 - a. if we have 17 totes for 20 spaces, that leaves 3 for boards
- 9. Dave M. moved to authorize up to \$150.00 to purchase 20 totes at Costco, Stan seconded, all said "Aye"
 - a. Dave C. will pick these up at Costco tomorrow
- 10. purchase baggies?
 - a. 500 count, with zippers
 - b. quart-size too small, have to go with gallon-size
 - c. does Costco have a sale on Ziploc bags?
 - d. they come in 2 quart-sized bags
 - 1. they come with 2 queens
 - 2. set them beside board
 - e. Stan moved to authorize up to \$250 for 500 gallon-size baggies w/ zipper, Dave M. seconded, all said "Aye"
 - 1. go for freezer version if available
 - 2. if not, get the regular kind
- D. getting back to plaques
 - 1. Buddy provided some examples of what we could use
 - a. 10.5 x 13" for top 5 teams, 10 in total
 - b. 8 x 10" for other 20 top teams, 40 in total
 - 2. layout for plaques
 - a. three elements to consist of tournament title (with section and place information), name of organization putting on the tournament, and Visit Tri-Cities logo
 - b. landscape or portrait orientation (ask Buddy for both examples)
 - 1. title of tournament at top, most prominent
 - 2. prize information in middle: section, place, etc.
 - 3. 2 logos on the bottom, side by side
 - 4. font sizes need to be bigger for tournament title
 - 5. Dave C. says it would almost have to be portrait
 - 6. different fonts for different lines?
 - a. to make it more interesting looking
 - 7. different colors for different lines?
 - a. metal is white, so the only color he can't print is white, white in design will have to be gold or silver
 - b. opt for silver, closer to white
 - 8. Buddy will provide examples by tomorrow night
 - a. board will respond then
 - 3. Dave M. moved to spend up to \$1,200 on plaques, Stan seconded, all said "Aye"

- a. \$250 for 10 plaques, top 5
- b. \$800 for 40 plaques, 6-25 place
- c. total comes to \$1050.00 plus tax
- 4. Review finances

 - 1. for chess sets
- H. New total \$32.965.50
- I. when do we need to write another check for TRAC?
- J. check for City of Pasco permits cleared
 - 1. Stan paid \$20.00 out of pocket for additional hat vendor
 - 2. wants to wait to see if amount paid for these is correct before reimbursement
- K. do we know the price point for food vendors?
 - 1. Edith asked for meal vouchers for PSD players
 - a. each player allotted a per diem rate for meals
 - b. district can approve a bump to the cap for each person
 - c. not all players will be able to leave premises for lunch
- 5. Review WSECC proposal from Elliott
 - A. Dave M. suggests counter-proposal
 - 1. West side welcome to form non-profit
 - 2. when it's the East side's turn to host tournament
 - a. hire their people for pairings
 - b. no need to hire organizer
 - 1. WECC responsible for this
 - c. no need to hire tournament director
 - 1. Lauren Schmidt a good candidate
 - d. pay their organization a standard fee to assist East side
 - 3. initial proposal stems from a desire for consistency
 - a. each year, tournament operates essentially the same
 - 4. would it be easier on the board members every 6 years if we agree?
 - a. no, we would still need to do the legwork
 - 5. we would send them money for:
 - a. registrations, \$1 per person = \$1000
 - b. Elliott's services at the start of tournament, for round 1 pairings
 - 1. about \$1000
 - c. actual pairings throughout tournament = \$1000
 - d. scholarship fund, donate \$1000
 - e. can't give much more than that, or we cannot go on

- f. \$250 to Northwest Chess for ratings service
- 6. Dave M. will respond to Elliott along these lines
- 6. Review lessons learned chart
 - A. posted set of directions for set up crew
 - 1. currently have about 30 volunteers for set up
 - B. door monitoring, letting the kids in
 - C. signs for sale items?
 - D. inform Information Booth of changes so they can field questions
 - 1. no longer relevant since we are doing no check-in
 - E. paper and pens at Info Booth
 - 1. Dave C. will handle this
 - 2. Doug will ask GESA about securing a pen donation
 - a. as many as 2000
 - F. have a photo backdrop spot set up
 - 1. talk to Diana about this
 - G. map of team tables
 - 1. Edith will help Dave M. work on that tomorrow
 - H. need reminder email one week in advance about check-in
 - 1. no longer relevant with preliminary pairings procedure
 - 2. Ben Radin will send out test notification a week out
 - a. another test 2 days out
 - b. night before a confirmation notification
 - I. volunteer information sheet to make sure everyone is well aware of their respective responsibilities
 - 1. Dave M. will ask Diana about this at next tournament
 - J. key for 3-letter codes for school names
 - 1. needs to work both ways: code-school, school-code
 - 2. Dave M. and Edith will work on this also
 - 3. Edith has already started looking at codes for West side schools
 - a. to coordinate families with players at different schools to sit together
 - b. based on regional proximity
 - K. having ratings on pairing sheets caused a lot of griping
 - 1. will need to remove that on pairings posted
 - 2. need the ratings on the score sheets given to Elliott's crew
 - 3. alphabetic pairings do not require ratings
 - L. scoring sheets for judges confused many players
 - M. pairings posted in one location, more than one location?
 - 1. with text/email notifications, will one posting suffice?
 - 2. Edith says some families do not opt in for notifications
 - 3. alpha pairings only in tournament area
 - a. standings posted in team room
 - N. judges badges
 - 1. we need these!
 - 2. color-coded badges?
 - a. head judges badge

- 1. to mediate disputes
- 2. one per section
- b. regular judges badge
- c. tournament director badge
- 7. respond to Diana's emails
 - A. we will not be using room #4
 - 1. she indicated she may need this for something else
 - 2. the only need for us to use room 4 is to accommodate overflow, more than 1000 players
 - B. Expo Hall
 - 1. 320 8' tables?
 - a. tables provided by rental company
 - b. maybe has wrong number listed
 - c. we need 85 tables
 - d. 105 tables reserved in case
 - C. room #2 will contain First Aid, Lost & Found
 - D. need to make it clear that we will pay for 2 power points per 5 tables
 - 1. even though electrician will set up 3 power points
 - 2. 6 power points for vendors
 - a. 5 20amp on North wall
 - b. 1 20amp on West wall
 - c. Ethernet connection available for Elliott
 - E. Dave M. needs to know the absolute drop-dead date to finalize details
 - 1. since we will be making adjustments as more players register
 - F. TRAC will provide 200 6' tables for tournament room
 - 1. we will supplement these with 8' tables
 - a. use longer tables for smaller kids
 - b. or request 6' tables from Bennett Rental
 - c. do we want to order 85 8' tables from Bennett and additional 6' tables from elsewhere, Pasco Rental
 - G. may need more chairs from Pasco Rentals
 - H. team table detail map, on website
 - 1. does not show power specifications
 - I. test out Ethernet in Board Room
 - 1. schedule meeting with Diana for this Friday, early afternoon, 1pm
 - J. hotels almost all booked up
 - 1. Shiloh the only remaining hotel with space
 - a. will comp rooms as more rooms are reserved
 - 2. 2 of 3 comped rooms already designated
 - a. offer t-shirt vendor the third
- 8. Schedule next meeting April 2nd at Dave's house at 7:30pm
- 9. Dave M. moved to adjourn meeting at 10:08pm, Stan seconded, all said "Aye"
